Voter ID to be needed at primary election

The primary election in Nebraska is Tuesday, May 14. For the first time, every voter will need to present identification.

"During the General Election 2022, there was a constitutional amendment asking voters if they wanted voter identification in elections," said Stephanie Laska, Butler County clerk. "The majority voted yes; then in June 2023, the legislature passed LB514 implementing voter identification. This primary will be the first election that implements voter ID and every election after will have it as well."

A Nebraska driver's license or state ID card can be used, as well as other documents. For more information, contact the county clerk's office.

Those voting in person should go to the same polling place as in previous years. Those with questions about their polling location, state ID or anything else election-related can call the county clerk's office.

Brad Vandenberg and incumbent Ryan Svoboda have both filed for the District 6 seat on the Butler County Board of Supervisors. Both candidates are Republicans so this race will be decided at the primary election.

Voting for seats open on the East Butler Board of Education will advance to the general election in the fall, as will the Brainard Village Board. No one has yet filed for two seats up for re-election on the Brainard Village Board. Those seats are currently held by Randy Robeson and John (Steve) Hummel. Filing deadline for village board is July 15 for incumbents and Aug. 1 for non-incumbents.

Oak Creek Township meets at 8 p.m.

Board meetings for Oak Creek Township have moved to summer hours. Meetings are held the third Wednesday of each month at the Legion building. Start time is 8 p.m. now through October.

Svoboda declines to return questionnaire

Ryan Svoboda, incumbent for District 6 on the Butler County Board of Supervisors, was to be featured in this issue of The Clipper. Both Svoboda and Brad Vandenberg have filed for the District 6 seat and were sent questionnaires from The Clipper, with their answers to help voters make a decision between the two. Vandenberg was featured in the last issue since his completed questionnaire was received first.

When contacted to see if he was going to return the questionnaire, Svoboda texted: "I usually send personal letters to people in my district so not concerned about the paper."

Legislative candidates at local forum

Five of six candidates running for an open seat for District 23 in the Nebraska Legislature appeared at a Candidate Forum, held at the Butler County Events Center on March 18. Present were Dennis Fujan and Allie French, both of Prague; Alan Zavodny and Jared Storm, both of David City; and Jacob Wolff of Colon. Not present was Larissa Schultz of Yutan, who was unable to attend.

The District 23 seat is currently held by Bruce Bostelman of Brainard, who cannot run for re-election due to term limits.

Clarkson Historical Museum hosts open house

The Clarkson Historical Museum will hold an open house Sunday, April 14, from noon to 4 p.m. The public is invited. Clarkson Historical Museum was established in August 1967 and is located at 221 Pine Street in Clarkson. It is a self supporting, non-profit private organization.

The museum features 24 rooms with more than 15,000 Czech heritage artifacts including 250 pieces of Czechoslovakian pottery; military room with 40 military uniforms and artifacts; farm room with 300 toy farm tractors; knife display; wedding dress display (30 dresses); two kitchens; school room and new library area. Recently added is a nine foot detailed map of every city and village in Czechoslovakia.
